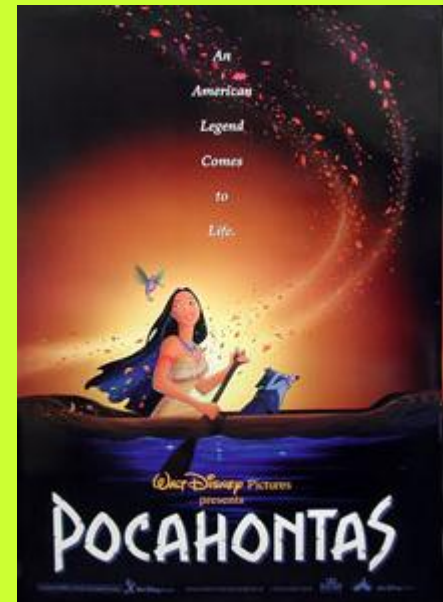

Pocahontas

Pocahontas was her nickname. She had three names in total.

“Mataoka“ which meant little snow feather, “ Amonte “ which was her parents’ name for her and “Pocahontas“ which meant lively or naughty one.

Pocahontas traded with the colonists and carried **messages** from her father to them.

The algonquin tribe traded **maize** and they ate bread made from the flour.

Copper was also highly treasured by Powhatan.

Pocahontas

When Pocahontas was 17, the Powhatans and the English started fighting again.

Pocahontas was **kidnapped** and held hostage by the colonists.

She stayed in prison for a year.

She became a **Christian** and she was renamed Rebecca.

In 1614, she married a tobacco planter John Rolfe.

This helped the end the war between the Powhatans and the English colonists.

Two years later Rebecca and her family went to England to be **successful**.

Unfortunately, while she was in England she met the King of England, James 1st.

On the **voyage** back home she got ill and died in England. She was only 22.
